

Introduction to Lead at EPA

Lead Based Paint Regulations & Definitions



EPA's Lead-Based Paint Rules Prevent Childhood Lead Exposure and Poisoning By educating consumers and regulating businesses involved with Target Housing and Child Occupied Facilities.

Target Housing (TH)

is any pre-1978 built housing. Housing for elderly persons or disabled persons and 0-bedroom dwellings are exempt unless a child is present. Target housing includes residential **Child Occupied Facilities**.

Child Occupied Facility (COF)

is a pre-1978 built building, regularly visited by a child under six years of age. Child-occupied facilities may be public or commercial buildings or in **target housing**.



EPA's Lead-Based Paint Rules



In TH:

- Sellers/lessors educate buyers/renters about potential lead paint hazards.
- Allows buyers/renters to make informed decisions prior to purchasing/leasing



- Firms and Renovators must be certified and follow Lead-Safe Work Practices.
- Record keeping informs residents of potential hazards and documents compliance.

1018 Disclosure PA's Pisclosure Rule became effective on March 6, 1996.

Prior to buying/renting **Target Housing** the seller/lessor must
provide the buyer/renter with:

- 1) A copy of "Protect Your Family" pamphlet.
- 2) A completed, signed and dated, disclosure of lead-based paint; which includes a "Lead Warning Statement", disclosure of all known lead paint information, and copies of all available lead records.



1018 Disclosure Rule: Lead Records

RRP Testing Results

A Certified Renovator may perform lead testing prior to a renovation; the results become lead records Abatement
Testing &
Clearance

Clearance
A Risk Accessor identifies lead hazards, or the lack of lead; the results become a lead records.

Lead Records Must Be Provided by Lessor/Seller <u>Prior</u> to Rental/Purchase

Renovation, Repair & Painting Rule

Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) § 402(c)(3); & 40 CFR §§ 745.80-92

Renovation, Repair & PA's PRINTED BECAME ef Parating Rule 10.

Regulates compensated work that disturbs painted surfaces in pre-1978 residential buildings, and COFs with children under six years of age Includes certification, training, recordkeeping, and post renovation cleaning requirements.



RRP is <u>not</u> Abatement

Its all about intent

Renovation, Repair & Painting (RRP)

- Disturbs lead-based paint in TH or COFs
- Work performed at request of the property owner, with the intent to renovate.
- Work is done by Certified Renovator & Firm; training is 8 hours

Lead Abatement

- Eliminates lead-based paint hazards
- Work can be ordered by state/local government with the intent to remove Lead.
- Work is done by state licensed Abatement Contractor; training is 40 hours

Who Must Follow RRP?



Anyone who receives compensation for work that disturbs paint in **TH** & **COF's** built before 1978, including:

- Renovators
- Landlords
- Painters
- Carpenters
- Roofing
- Flooring

- Window replacement
- Property managers
- Childcare owners/operators
- Maintenance staff
- Electricians & plumbers

RRP Exceptions

- Renovations of lead-based paint free components
- Disturbing less 6 ft² per room or 20 ft² exterior
- Work done in housing they own & occupy
- Demolitions of an entire free-standing building or structure
- Lead abatement

- Contact EPA
 EPA will follow-up on referrals

Inspections

Gather information, take photos, & conduct interviews



Guidance

Review or provide FAQ answers. Assist with use of EPA language.



Compliance Assistance

Instruct parties to compliance. Provide Outreach information.



Enforcement

Determine response; Referrals, Case Developement
